

Getting around Lambeth is easy and convenient, with frequent and well-connected routes, making it simple to explore the local attractions.

► WALKING

Walking around Lambeth is a wonderful way to explore the borough's mix of cultural landmarks, green spaces, and local charm. Lambeth is committed to reducing single-use plastic and many local establishments participate in the Refill London initiative, allowing you to refill your water bottle for no cost. Take a look at the free **Refill app**, which provides further information.

► PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Frequent buses and trains operate in the area, visit www.tfl.gov.uk for up-to-date information and to plan your journey. Use contactless or the Oyster card for the most cost-effective way to travel.



► CYCLING

For those who prefer to cycle, you can hire electric and pedal bikes via the **Santander Cycles app** to explore the extensive network of Cycle Superhighways, Quietways and popular routes including Clapham Common and the nearby green spaces.



SCHOOL STREETS WALKING TOUR

① ALBERT SQUARE (SW8 1BU)

To start the tour, arrive at Albert Square where two large rain gardens have been installed to enhance the space and improve surface water management.

② DORSET ROAD (SW8 1AL)

Look at a rain garden designed in an innovative curved shape to include seating and improve community engagement.

③ FENTIMAN ROAD (SW8 1LD)

At this site review the four rain gardens with additional tree planting that replaced previous LTN planters.

④ CLAYLANDS ROAD (SW8 1NU)

To finish the rain garden tour, there are six rain gardens across this space that provide year-round interest and prevent flooding.

⑤ ST MARK'S CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY & NURSERY SCHOOL (SE11 5SL)

St Mark's School Street, as well as Henry Fawcett School Street, are at the heart of Kennington Oval Reimagined. Observe the changes made outside both schools, focusing on the pedestrianisation outside St Mark's.




EXPLORE LIKE A LOCAL

Lambeth is a vibrant, diverse and culturally rich borough of London, offering visitors a mix of history, art, green spaces, and community spirit.

► ATTRACTIONS

History buffs will enjoy **Windrush Square**, a public square that celebrates the Windrush generation and is home to **The Black Cultural Archives** dedicated to the history and culture of Black people in the UK. You can also visit **Electric Avenue**, famous as the first street in London to be lit by electricity. It's now a bustling area for shopping and food.



Each of these spots offers something unique and reflects the cultural richness of the Lambeth and Brixton area.



► STREET ART

Lambeth is a vibrant borough with a thriving street art scene.



The most iconic is the **David Bowie mural** on Tunstall Road near Brixton Underground station. A striking portrait of Bowie in his Aladdin Sane persona is a landmark and a place of homage for fans.



Visit **Windrush Square** featuring murals

depicting the story of the Windrush generation and their cultural contributions or **Lambeth Walk**,

where you will find murals that reflect the history and spirit of the local community, including references to the famous song "Doing the Lambeth Walk".



► STREET FOOD

The street food scene is one of the most lively and culinary diverse areas in London, which

includes **Brixton Village Market**, a historic indoor market packed with street food stalls, small eateries, and independent vendors within **Pop Brixton**.

► NIGHTLIFE

For a night out, head to **Pop Brixton**, a trendy space made from shipping containers, home to stalls, bars and pop-up events. **Ritzy Cinema** is a historic cinema offering films, events, and a café/bar with a terrace overlooking Windrush Square or head over to the **O2 Academy Brixton**, a famous music venue hosting concerts and events, known for its Art Deco design and incredible acoustics.
